*Sibao Publishing Houses and Publisher-Booksellers*

## D.1: Sibao Publishing Houses (tentative)

As explained in Chapter 1, it is not possible to verify the accuracy of most of the following publishing house names, founders' names, and founding dates. They are drawn largely from oral histories recorded in the most recent genealogies and (in very rare cases) the early twentieth-century genealogies. This is therefore a tentative list.

N.B.: The publishing houses are arranged roughly chronologically by date of founding. The following abbreviations are used—for era names: KX, Kangxi, 1661–1722; JQ, Jiaqing, 1795–1820; DG, Daoguang, 1821–50; XF, Xianfeng, 1851–61; TZ, Tongzhi, 1862–74; GX, Guangxu, 1875–1908; for names of provinces: FJ, Fujian; GD, Guangdong; GX, Guangxi; HB, Hubei; HN, Hunan; JS, Jiangsu; JX, Jiangxi; SC, Sichuan; YN, Yunnan; ZJ, Zhejiang. “Ma Jiashu 1996” refers to Ma Jiashu 马嘉澍, “Mawu diaoban yinshuaye chayue ziliao” 马屋雕版印刷业查阅资料, 1996. LZ stands for “Liezhuàn” 列傳 and SX for “Shìxì” 世係, different sections of the 1993 edition of the *Mashi dazong zupu*. The following abbreviations are used for the sources:
