## Sibao Publishing Houses and Publisher-Booksellers

## D.I: Sibao Publishing Houses (tentative)

As explained in Chapter 1, it is not possible to verify the accuracy of most of the following publishing house names, founders' names, and founding dates. They are drawn largely from oral histories recorded in the most recent genealogies and (in very rare cases) the early twentieth-century genealogies. This is therefore a tentative list

N.B.: The publishing houses are arranged roughly chronologically by date of founding.
